Nice of you to ask. Due to our timing of both money and time, we were not so ideal as we could have been on our applications, but we did see a good improvement. We had about half the duckweed density compared with the year before. We also see that our soft clay in the bottom due to organic material is quite deep due to the field runoff over the last 40 years. There is much digestion left to go to make this pond healthy. This soft clay is about 3 ft. deep in the deep areas. Within about 10 ft. of the bubbler air, the clay has become hard with a couple of years of aeration. I hope that the Winter Warrior will tend to live in the pond more and continue this great work. Yes the duckweed is currently frozen out. We hope to get ahead of it this year.
